#### Dear Friends and Colleagues

It is our great pleasure to cordially invite you, on behalf of The Hungarian Society for the Study of Obesity (HSSO) and the European Association for the Study of Obesity (EASO), to attend the 15<sup>th</sup> European Congress on Obesity in Budapest, Hungary, from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> April 2007.

Obesity poses one of the greatest public health challenges for the 21st century, with particularly alarming trends in several parts of the world, including Europe. The prevalence of adult obesity has risen three-fold in many European countries since the 1980s. The epidemic is spreading at particularly high rates in children. Indeed, the management of Obesity and its related disorders is now at the forefront of Government and Public Health initiatives across Europe. A comprehensive and exciting scientific programme has been developed by a committee of leading experts, chaired by Professor Wim Saris. The programme comprises 4 main tracks: Cellular and Molecular Mechanisms; Integrated Physiological Systems; Disease and Treatment; and Public Health and Prevention. The interdisciplinary nature of Obesity research and education allows the programme to address key issues on Obesity and its co-morbidities, thus being of the highest relevance to those working in a variety of specialties.

In addition to the main Congress programme, some interesting satellite symposia will address specific topics relating to Obesity management. The Hungarian Society for the Study of Obesity (HSSO) was founded in Siofok, Hungary on 19<sup>th</sup> September 1999, as an organisation of public usefulness and to continue the aims and activities of its predecessor, The Hungarian Foundation for the Study of Obesity (HFSO), which was established in 1992.

The scope of HSSO is:

- To bring together individuals interested in obesity, both from research and management backgrounds
- To promote preventive, diagnostic and curative medical approaches of obesity
- To participate in graduate and post-graduate teaching programmes for clinicians and health care professionals in obesity-related fields
- To collaborate with other national societies in the organisation of joint events on obesity related topics

HSSO became a member of EASO in 1999 and of the International Association for the Study of Obesity (IASO) in 2000. The original foundation organised a large number of events for its members including 19 national and 10 regional conferences plus 8 symposia. An expert group produced the proceedings of the Consensus Conference of Obesity held in 1998, providing a state-of-the-art report and guidelines for healthcare professionals on the diagnosis, treatment, aetiology and prevention of obesity (including childhood obesity). The latest Consensus Conference on Obesity was held on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2004.

In 2000, HSSO founded its own scientific journal, Obesitologia Hungarica. HSSO now has 387 members and has organised annual conferences since 1992 on a wide range of themes including Hypertension and Obesity, Food Intake Disorders, Absorption of Carbohydrates and Lipids, Metabolic Causes of Cardiac Disease and Childhood Obesity.







#### The Christian Museum and Basilica in Esztergom\*

The town of Esztergom, 70 km from Budapest, is the seat of the Hungarian Roman Catholic Church. It was a royal seat until the 13<sup>th</sup> century, and St. Stephen was crowned here.

The cathedral is Hungary's largest church, and the Christian Museum is one of the largest of its kind in Europe.

#### Trip to Hollókő (World Heritage Site)\*

Secluded among the ridges of the Cserhất Hills, Hollókő was the first village to be declared a World Heritage site. The medieval structure of the village is unique: 58 buildings make up the town's centre with a white-washed picturesque church.

The exhibitions in Kossuth street evoke the 19<sup>th</sup> century. No. 82 houses a traditionally structured Village Museum depicting life in the 1920's.

The Doll Museum displays a collection of 200 large porcelain dolls in colourful Palóc costumes and the 13<sup>th</sup> century castle atop the hill offers a splendid view of the landscape and the old village. The Bükk National Park visitor centre is dedicated to wildlife in the Hollókő region, the culture of the Palóc community and the life of the farmers.

#### Lake Balaton and Tihany Peninsula\*

Lake Balaton, also know as the 'Hungarian Sea', lies at the heart of the Transdanubia region. This lake, Central Europe's largest, is 77 km long with opalescent, yellow-green waters covering 600 square kilometres.

First stop is the Tihany Peninsula, a famous nature reserve with a variety of rare flora and fauna. We will then visit the Benedictine Abbey which was founded in 1055. #### **Arriving in Budapest**

Budapest Ferihegy Airport is located approximately 15 miles south-east of Budapest and has two main terminals. There are several ways of travelling between the city and Ferihegy Airport.

The Airport Minibus Service takes you to any destination in Budapest within 25-40 minutes depending on traffic. This costs approximately 2,300 HUF one way or 3,900 HUF return. Tickets are available at the Airport Minibus Service desk in the arrival hall.

Taxis are available at both Terminals. The fare to the city centre is approximately 3,700 - 4,200 HUF.

The official currency in Hungary is the Forint. There are coins of 1, 2, 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 Forint. Notes come in denominations of 200, 500, 1.000, 2.000, 5.000, 10.000 and 20.000 Forint. Currency can be exchanged at banks, Bureau de Change, hotel receptions and at travel offices. Banks are usually open Monday to Thursday between 08:00 – 15:00, Fridays between 08:00 – 13:00. All banks are closed on Saturdays, but numerous currency exchange offices are open at weekends.


